- Users can explore the exciting virtual map then refine and personalise the search options to best suit your situation.
- Launched December 2021.

Project 2- Communication, Community Engagement and Extension Officer





- Our CCEE Officer Brydie Murrihy was tasked with building community capacity through community extension services, developing learning resources, engaging with key stockholders and promoting the VGT and its cause.


The Virtual Extension Officer - New interactive website


The new VGT website

We are confident our new <u>website</u> and resources will assist you and your communities to effectively control gorse.


